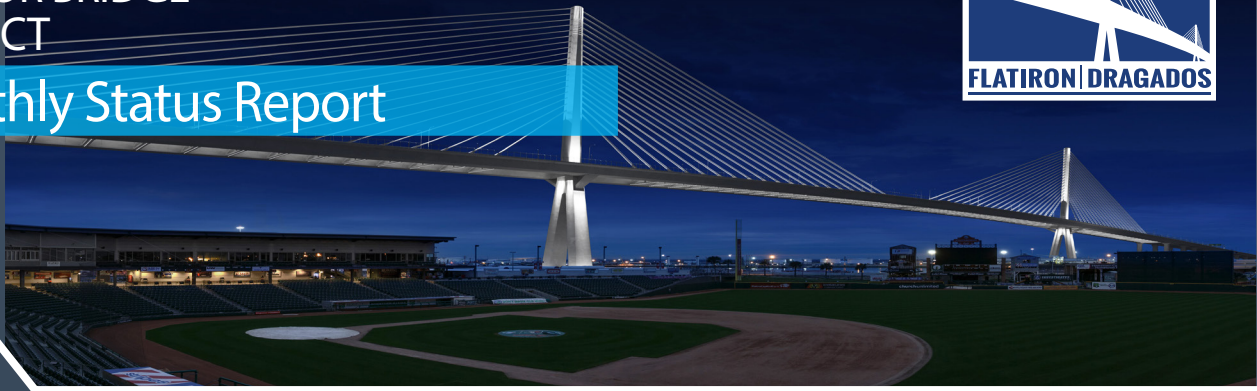

Harbor Bridge Project (HBP) Annual Safety Week – 2021

Every day, we walk onto the construction site with one goal in mind – get the job done safely! Our crews feel an unwavering responsibility to one another and our families to ensure everyone returns home safely. The physical and mental demands of our work extend beyond the safety checklist of PPE gear, equipment inspections, and protocols on the job site. Everyone who enters the Project must complete a Safety Orientation, which includes awareness topics to detect unseen threats such as stress at home or fatigue that can affect reaction times.

Safety Week on the HBP takes months to coordinate the events that bring our team together for updates on construction safety innovations and refreshers on strengthening our safety culture. Fundamental Safety Week tenets continue year-round through Daily Risk Assessments (DRA's), weekly Monday morning “toolbox” meetings, and monthly sunrise assemblies. Project-wide, May 3 – 7 was a week filled with Safety demonstrations, video training, camaraderie, prizes, and food trucks! Mandatory videos covered: heavy equipment, trench and excavation safety, fall protection, heavy lifting, and avoiding being caught between or struck by obstacles. All HBP personnel enjoyed food trucks featuring breakfast tacos, hamburgers, hotdogs, and RASPAS! Family members were encouraged to participate in a children’s art competition where one boy and girl each won a bicycle. New Northbound IH 37 Entrance Ramp

Commuter connectivity and controlled access points are essential to the overall scope of the HBP Roadworks improvement packages. In May, we opened the new northbound IH 37 on-ramp between Port Avenue and Nueces Bay Boulevard to better serve the Hillcrest neighborhood and industry commuters. The opening occurred in tandem with shifting traffic onto a newly constructed Martin Luther King (MLK) Drive lane while construction progresses towards finishing the westbound frontage road.
